What is Thy Kingdom Come?

A global prayer movement inviting Christians around the world to pray for more people to come to know Jesus. Started in 2016 with an invitation from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York to the Church of England it has grown into an international and ecumenical call to prayer that in 2019 included Christians in 65 denominations in 178 countries joined together to pray "Come, Holy Spirit" so that friends and family, neighbours and colleagues might come to faith in Jesus Christ.

After the very first Ascension Day the disciples gathered with Mary, constantly devoting themselves to prayer while they waited for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Like them, we too need to rely on the gift of the Holy Spirit – on our own we can do nothing. Christians have always gathered at this time t pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit to equip us to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with their friends and family .

During these days of prayer, we're all encouraged to:

- Deepen our own relationship with Jesus
- Pray for 5 friends or family to come to faith in Jesus
- Pray for the Holy Spirit to fill us, and give us power and faith to share the gospel with others.

Step 3 For Jacquie: Dial 80 28 33 52#, then the PIN 32 59#

What can I pray about? Who cam I pray for? What am I asking God to do



How? Gather together things that you find help you to pray:

Your Bible, Morning and Night prayer leaflet, a candle & matches, a cross, note-book and pen. If you want a cup of tea or glass of water, get them too. Anything to reduce the risk of being distracted from praying.

Where? Find somewhere comfortable, with as few distractions as possible—but not too comfortable if you want to avoid falling asleep!)

What? Light your candle, and be still for a moment.

Praise: Read a psalm that helps you praise God for who he is.

Give Thanks: Spend time thanking God—for anything and everything. Remind yourself of all that is good.

Pray for:

The Diocesan vision Prayer. Pray it phrase by phrase; think about what we're asking for in this prayer.

For Bishop Pete, Canon Sophie, Archdeacons, all the senior staff, all those who work at Church House, all the clergy. Ask God to protect them, give them wisdom, help them in their responsibilities, bless their families.

For the 5 people you have chosen to pray for over these ten days.

For all those with responsibilities in dealing with this pandemic—from the government down—pray for wisdom, integrity, protection, encouragement.

Pray for your community:

For different streets by name, and pray for each street in turn—a few each day. Pray that our communities will discover God's love, forgiveness and salvation.

For those who live there—families, those living alone, or worried about money, or staying safe, or about their jobs.

The businesses—for employers worried about keeping going, pray for peace, and the help they need.

The schools. Teachers are still working, and worrying and caring for children. Pray for wisdom about the schools going back on June 1st.

Those who are ill. For peace, for the help they need. For comfort, especially are frightened; for healing.

The nursing homes—for the staff as they try to stay safe and keep their residents safe, and as they worry about taking the virus home, or bringing it into work.

The volunteers, working across our communities, making sure people have food and medication, and other things they need. Pray that they will stay safe, and will have the resources they need to help others.

Also pray for:

The Food Banks—Askern, Woodlands, Bentley, town centre. Pray for the food to keep coming in, and for patience for the volunteers as they sort and distribute food. Pray that those who need the food get it when they need it.

The NHS. Medical and nursing staff—and cleaning staff, porters, administrators, for GPs— for the whole NHS. Pray for safety for those on the frontline. Pray for wisdom for all those supporting them. Pray that everyone who needs PPE will get it.

For all keyworkers: dustmen, postmen, water board, gas and electric companies, emergency services, food producers, lorry drivers, shop staff.

Aid Agencies, Refugee Camps, and the poorer countries as Covid-19 spreads. Pray for peace not conflict. Pray for courage and protection for those making decisions and caring for the sick. Pray for healing, and for the virus to stop spreading.

For yourself

Spend time telling God how you're feeling, If today is a good day, be thankful. If it is a day of worry, anxiety, fear, sadness, or loneliness, tell Him about it. Ask for His peace; ask for comfort, ask Him to fill you with the Holy Spirit. Ask Him what he wants to say to you today.

Pray the Lord's Prayer

End by giving thanks. Thank God that He hears our prayers. Thank Him for answered prayer, for lives changed, for comfort and peace where it's needed.

They feature a game, an interactive Bible story (written and performed by folks like Bob Hartman), a chance to pray and great music. Do share them with families and other mixed-age groups, and use them alongside the Prayer Adventure Map and Journal.
